

Hinerongo has been taken captive. How is she feeling? Choose colours to show her emotions and the mood at the time.




Hinerongo has been captured. Although she was taken from Rangitāne Pā by Tūteurutira and his people, she is actually from Ngāti Māmoe.

She was only recently captured by Rangitāne and now she's captive again.




Hinerongo and Tūteurutira were given land at the Waiau Toa and they settled at Matariki Pā which was famous for its kūmara gardens.

This is Tūteurutira. He is a chief from Ngāti Kurī. He leads his warriors to battle. Select colours to show his chiefly status.


